SUBJECT : COMPLIANCE WITH ERC RULES AND ISSUANCES

DATE : JAN 17 2023

Beginning September 2022, the Energy Regulatory Commission (ERC) is furnishing copies of Show Cause Orders (SCOs) to the National Electrification Administration (NEA) regarding various violations committed by the electric cooperatives (ECs). Relative thereto, ERC requested NEA to exercise its *motu proprio* authority over the ECs pursuant to Presidential Decree No. 269, as amended by Republic Act No. 10531.

In view of the foregoing, all ECs are directed to take due cognizance of the SCOs being issued by the Honorable Commission. Likewise, All ECs are enjoined to observe timely submission of reportorial requirements and compliance with ERC rules and pertinent issuances such as, but not limited to the following:
